### FREIGHT FORWARDING FORUM

he Forum closed 2018 with the annual supply chain risk event that is held jointly in the City of London with the Chartered Institute of Procurement and Supply and CILT London Region. This event has been a fixture in Institute diaries for over a decade, and has always attracted great commercial and academic speakers who have addressed a wide range of topics in this critical area, informing, educating and entertaining the combined audiences.

International supply chains are complex, often fragmented and usually pressured, susceptible to risk along their entire length. From threats to raw materials compromising availability dates, to worker exploitation compromising brand values, supply chain risks are diverse, numerous and critical, which is why this event continues to attract a new audience every year. The latest one saw 120 delegates registering to hear speakers look at best practice in supply chain risk management and making sense of the technology wave.

Technology is transforming the freight sector, with the industry leaders investing in digitalisation solutions that offer shippers instant access to rates, bookings and customs with dashboard control across all their devices; and with the biggest committed, the rest of the market will follow. Despite the hype, we are early on in the digital transformation of our industry and there is a big opportunity for the most enlightened freight forwarders and the early technology adopters, because they will win and enjoy the benefits of earlier technology differentiation and increased market share. The Forum intends to host a number of events across the country to review the technology landscape and showcase the disruptors that are attracting the most interest and offer the best value for money to forwarders.

For some time, members of the Forum have participated in discussions with the Department for Transport's Freight Team, to provide guidance on priorities for EU exit negotiations. We will respond to the developing Brexit situation and host events to explore the opportunities that may accrue.

In achieving the Forum's mission of highlighting freight forwarding as a profession and raising awareness of the value of the sector, we invite corporate members, especially forwarders, shippers and logisticians, to consider hosting events that highlight their contribution to the nations supply chain. By understanding each other better and recognising the contribution made, forwarders profile will rise and awareness of the whole supply chain sector.
